Internationally besteening Brazinan author Faulo Coe-libo shared details of the progress of his upcoming book, The Aleph, via his weblog (http://paulocoelhoblog.com). According to the recent announcement, the author has fin-ished editing the forthcoming title, which is expected out in-ternationally in 2011, Independent reported. Coelho first posted details of the new work on his blog on March 13:

"In 2006 I was called to my 3rd sacred pilgrimage ... I went to several countries, but the epiphany happened while cross-ing Asia in the Trans-Iberian train (15 days, 7 different time zones, 9.2528 km from Moscow to Vladivostok). I was trav-elling with a Turkish girl, Hilal (not her real name), for reasons that you are going to dis-cover in the book. This point where time and space converge is called 'The Aleph' (JL. Borges has a wonderful short story about this point). Therefore, this is the title of my new book: 'The Aleph', ...Why did I take so long to write about this pilgrimage? Because it took me three full years to understand it.'' The author calls the experience "the first time I wrote a book in public", referring to his regular blog updates throughout the writing process.

Coento reports that the book will be reteased "very soon" in Brazil followed by a worldwide release in 2011. The writer is one of the world's bestselling novelists, hav-ing sold a reported 100 million books in more than 150 coun-tries and 67 languages. His 1988 title "The Alchemist" reached first place in bestseller lists in 74 countries and has sold 35 million exercise. million copies.


Movie Sets to Museum
